The Kingsley Junior Football Club is committed to providing a safe, fun and enjoyable environment for all participants, spectators and officials. To ensure we can do this we are requiring a representative from each family to sign and return the code of conduct on behalf of their family.

It is the responsibility of the player's parent/guardian to ensure that the player, family and friends who attend games understand this code of conduct.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Team manager delivers 'Parent, Guardian & Players – Code of Conduct' document to each family before season commences
2. Team manager collects returned and signed forms for **ALL** families; minimum of one per family before round 1
 - a. Please provide a list of players as supplied by the registrar with each ticked off when returned to you
3. When all forms are collected return to the Managers Co-ordinator or the Registrars Box

PARENT, GUARDIAN & PLAYERS - CODE OF CONDUCT

The Kingsley Junior Football Club fully supports the codes of conduct as introduced and implemented by the AFL and WAFL.

PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT

- Play by the rules - the rules of KJFC club and laws of the game
- Never argue with an umpire or other official - without these people, you can't play.
- Control your temper - verbal abuse of officials and sledging of other players doesn't help you enjoy or win any games
- Be a team player - It's a team game, treat it that way.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated - fairly.
- Co-operate with your coach, umpires and team-mates
- Play for your own enjoyment & to improve your skills.
- Don't use ugly remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability. These comments can be viewed as degrading and in some cases illegal - you'll let down your coach, team-mates and family if you do.

PARENT & SUPPORTERS CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others;
2. Remember, that your child participates in sport for their own enjoyment, not **YOURS**.
3. Focus on your child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
4. Never ridicule or yell at your child or other children for making a mistake or losing a competition.
5. Show appreciation for good performance and skilful play by all players (including opposing players).
6. Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility especially when dealing with or in the vicinity of any person under 18 years of age, as your words and actions are an example.
7. Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
8. Do not physically or verbally abuse or harass anyone associated with the sport (player, coach, umpire and so on).
9. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
10. Provide a safe environment for my child, including prompt collection of my child after training, games and club functions.
11. Be a positive role model.

By signing the below we to abide by these principles and will discuss them with our child and other supporters we invite to games. We support the Club in its undertakings and encourage the Club to take any necessary disciplinary actions including the suspension and banning where warranted of any players, parents and or spectators for repeated or serious breaches of these Codes of Conduct.
