EMERGENCY MEDICAL ACTION PLAN

REMEMBER THE WELL BEING OF THE INJURED PLAYER HAS FIRST PRIORITY

When a player is injured, the team first aid officer should immediately attend the injured player and assess the severity of the injury.

Remember: DRABC = Danger, Response, Airway, Breathing, and Compressions.

If the team first aid officer assesses that the injury is serious, get the umpires to stop the game immediately.

If a player is seriously injured, unconscious or has limited movement, ie if they cannot get on the stretcher unaided, they should not be moved, and an ambulance is required.

If the injury is assessed as being serious, task an adult to contact the ambulance services by dialling the '000' emergency number, brief them on the situation, ensure the access gate is open and meet the ambulance there when they arrive (refer next page for guidance).

Once an injury is diagnosed as serious, it is critical that the team first aid officer attends to and stays with the injured player until the ambulance arrives and takes control of the situation.

It is important that the rest of the players and spectators are kept clear of the injured person.

Contact the parent or guardian (if not present), and inform them of the ambulance request.

At the end of the game an "Injury Report Form" detailing the incident / injury is required to be submitted with weekly match paperwork. The Risk and Safety Coordinator will review all injury reports and arrange appropriate follow-up action where required.



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REQUESTING THE AMBULANCE

Call '000", you will be asked which emergency service you require.

After connection to the Ambulance service, the operator will ask the following:

- Where is the ambulance required? (see directions to KJFC grounds below)
- What is the injury? Are they conscious / unconscious?
- Do they have a lower or upper limb fracture, head injury or suspected spinal injury?
- The patient's name, and if possible their date of birth?

AMBULANCE DIRECTIONS TO KJFC GROUNDS

Kingsley Oval

Entry: Enter from Kingsley Drive, and enter through the main clubrooms.

Access: The access gate (if required) is located at the southern end of the western car park. The gate is open on match days.

Moolanda Oval

Entry: Enter from Harness St, off Moolanda Boulevard (at the northern end of the ground).

Access: The access gate (if required) is located next to the toilet block. The gate key is on the set held by the home team coach.
